EXAMINATION OF ACTS DONE IN THE DIVINE WILL!

1 CORITHIANS: 13:1-8

If I speak of tongues of men and of Angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.

- 5. Did I love God with His own Will sufficiently today for myself and for all souls of all generations?
- 6. Did I repair for all sins of all generations, past, present and future to give God the glory He is due?
- 7. Did I spend some silent time with God to help renew my soul by reading and obtaining more knowledge about His Most Holy Will?
- 8. Did I pray the prayers which the Holy Ghost inspired me, especially the Holy Rosary which Jesus said would bring the Kingdom to earth?
- 9. Did I attend Holy Mass today, if possible, to absorb in my soul the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus for His glory in the name of all generations?
- 10. Did I meditate on the Passion of Our Lord as He requested in the writings of Luisa, most especially by reading the "The Hours of the Passion of Our Lord, Jesus Christ."?
